

FOR THE COMMUNITY...

















...BY THE COMMUNITY

Site must be in city of Columbus corporation limits*.

*Additional consideration will be given to project sites in opportunity neighborhoods

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Primary applicant must be 18 years or older.

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Teams should have appropriate **insurance** and/or **waivers** for implementation and use of site.

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Teams should have appropriate **insurance** and/or **waivers** for implementation and use of site.

Organizations must be **able to receive grant funds** - either directly or through a fiscal agent.

WHAT CAN FUNDING SUPPORT

Grants of up to \$15,000 are available to selected awardees.

Permit + Application Fees

Examples include: permits, Site Compliance Reviews, Variances, etc.

Supplies + Equipment Rental

Examples include: plant material, furnishings, scaffolding, power washers, etc.

Vendor + Contractor Payments

Examples include: muralist fees, electrician, general contractor, sign vendors, etc.

Food + Water for Volunteers

No more than \$500 can be spent to support volunteers

OVERVIEW

The Neighborhood Design Center (NDC), in partnership with Councilmember Lourdes Barroso de Padilla and the City of Columbus Department of Neighborhoods, invites teams of neighborhood residents and community organizations to submit proposals for inclusive placemaking opportunities to celebrate neighborhoods across the city. 614 Beautiful is a program aimed at beautifying and unifying Columbus communities through place-based, public-facing improvements achievable with \$15,000 of project support.

Beautification projects may include, but are not limited to: pocket parks, landscape enhancements, streetscape improvements, placemaking signage, and/or public art, and must be located within City of Columbus corporation limits. 614 Beautiful proposals should engage nearby residents, neighborhood businesses, and organizations, address environmental justice concerns, and create safe and equitable spaces. A jury consisting of project stakeholders and design professionals will review submissions and select winners to implement proposals.

ABOUT THE PROGRAM:

614 Beautiful seeks to beautify communities through vibrant, neighborhood-driven solutions that address issues of equity and enable greater connectivity within the neighborhood. In addition to activating spaces and places, the program aims to encourage dialogue amongst neighbors, local businesses, and organizations, and promote creativity and ingenuity in strategies that support all. Applicants should consider the following:

- Grants of up to \$15,000 will be awarded to selected proposals.
- Projects must be located within the City of Columbus corporation limits. While project sites are open citywide, additional consideration will be given to those in identified opportunity neighborhoods.
- Proposals may include but are not limited to pocket parks, landscape enhancements, public right-of way
 improvements' (ex. sidewalk activation, transit-oriented improvements), placemaking signage, and/or
 public art (see examples on the program website). The proposals cannot be solely used for community
 gardens, but may enhance an existing garden or community space for better public access/activation.
- Proposals must be in publicly accessible locations within the community.
- Implementation of the proposal, including the purchase of materials, payments to vendors, and
 acquisition of appropriate permits, are the responsibility of the entrant. Project implementation must
 involve the community (concept approval, volunteering, neighborhood contractors)
- Entrants are responsible for community buy-in and should consult with appropriate neighborhood stakeholder groups representing the community regarding final design considerations.

* Please note public right of way improvements will require coordination and approval from the Public Service Division of the City of Columbus

15-Slide Presentation

At a minimum, presentations must include:

- 1 slide of existing site conditions
- 2 slides detailing team, partners, and community engagement strategy
- 3 slides of the proposed idea with clear description of proposed changes
- 1 slide of proposed project budget, including contingency
- 2 slides detailing implementation process
- 1 slide detailing maintenance plan

Are there any specific skillisets needed (i.e. electrician, carpenter, excavation, etc.) Have you considered partnerships with organizations to help with implementation? 

EVALUATION CRITERIA

A jury of program stakeholders and design professionals will evaluate on the following criteria:

Project Feasibility [30 PTS]

With the process outlined, does the project have the capcity to implement the idea?

Is the timeline to execute the project fair and reasonable?

Is the project within budget, or able to secure additional funds/donations to complete?

Does the organization show ability to maintain the project once complete?

EVALUATION CRITERIA

A jury of program stakeholders and design professionals will evaluate on the following criteria:

Project Feasibility [30 PTS]

Community Benefit + Activation [40 PTS]

Is the idea supported by the community?

Is the project inclusive of the target audience and/or neighborhood?

Is the project site in an opportunity neighborhood?

Is the community involved in the implementation of the project?

EVALUATION CRITERIA

Project Feasibility [30 PTS]

Community Benefit + Activation [40 PTS]

Creativity [30 PTS]
